


Panama Report Overview (updated as of Feb 1, 2021)

This is an overview of the economic and industry related information for Panama. This report will summarize the economic state of Panama and changes resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Panama Overview and Economic Summary


Prior to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and, despite economic growth losing momentum in the last years, Panama has been one of the fastest growing economies in the world, with an average annual growth rate of 4.6% over the past five years. Growth in Panama for 2020 is expected to contract significantly, with main employment areas such as services and construction impacted. However, positive contributions to growth are expected to come from public expenditure, with subsequent increase in the fiscal deficit and public debt. A slight recovery is expected during 2021, driven by a rebound in trade, leading to the resumption of key services such as transport, logistics, and other sectors connected to the Canal, as well as construction and mining, combined with improvements in domestic consumption and investments.²

COVID-19 Impact and 2020 Economic Data

Panama's economic growth for 2020 is expected to significantly decrease within main employment areas such as services and construction. Although most sectors have been hit, positive contributions to growth are expected to come from public expenditure, with subsequent increase in the fiscal deficit and public debt. A slight recovery is expected during 2021, driven by a rebound in trade, leading to the resumption of key services such as transport, logistics, and other sectors connected to the Panama Canal, an essential highway for the world's goods. Construction and mining combined with improvements in domestic consumption and investments is also expected to increase slightly.

Major Industries and Trends



Many of the major industries in Panama surround the universally known Panama Canal. The Canal and the industries that support its operation are some of the most crucial to the Panamanian economy. The services industry in the country provides upwards of 80% of the GDP, while heavy industries provide ~15% and ~2% from agriculture.³ Panama was traditionally known for trade, as its strategic geographic position making the country a hotspot for international maritime trade. The canal was completed in 1914, and quickly became an essential hub for international trade.

Major Cities

Panama City

Panama City the capital and largest city of Panama. It has an urban population of 880,691, with over 1.5 million in its metropolitan area. The city is located at the Pacific entrance of the Panama Canal, in the province of Panama. The city is the political and administrative center of the country, as well as a hub for banking and commerce.⁴

Unemployment rate: 10.06%

As the economic and financial center of the country, Panama City's economy is service based, heavily weighted toward banking, commerce, and tourism. The economy depends significantly on trade and shipping activities associated with the Panama Canal and port facilities located in Balboa. Panama's status as a convergence zone for capital from around the world due to the canal helped the city establish itself as a prime location for offshore banking and tax planning.⁵

David is a city and province in the west of Panama. It is the capital of the province of Chiriquí. It is a relatively affluent city with firmly established, dominant middle class and a very low unemployment and poverty index. The Pan-American Highway is a popular route to David. It is named after King David from the Bible.

Population: ~85,000

GDP per capita: \$16,245

Unemployment rate: N/A



The development of the banking sector, public construction works such as the expansion of the airport and the David-Boquete highway has increased its prominence as one of the fastest growing regions in the country. The city is the economic center of the Chiriquí province and produces more than half the gross domestic product of the province, which totals \$2.1 billion. It is known for being the third-largest city in the country both in population and by GDP.⁶⁷
